A

Online shoppers often notice that each item is packed individually and then protected by extra packaging. Some e-commerce companies are taking action. Amazon® has reduced over 665,000 tons of packaging by using recyclable materials. Alibaba has set up 75,000 recycling centres to reuse boxes and wrapping materials. Dell® uses packing materials made from recycled or natural sources.

B

Plastic packaging makes up nearly half of all global plastic waste, according to a UN report in 2018. Reducing packaging waste is a major challenge for manufacturers, retailers, and the public. Everyone knows its environmental impact. However, it is not easy to change habits or systems, and many people wonder if real progress is happening yet.

C

A new delivery system called Loop could change how people shop. Products are delivered in refillable and reusable containers made of glass, stainless steel, or durable plastic. Once used, the packaging is collected, cleaned, and reused. This system encourages people to avoid single-use plastics. Experts hope it could change consumer habits over time.

D

Consumers' choices are encouraging retailers to act. Many shops now offer bag-free options or alternatives to plastic bags. In the UK, most supermarkets have promised to eliminate single-use plastics by 2025. Buying decisions influence manufacturers too. More eco-friendly packaging is being developed as retailers respond to growing awareness about sustainability and environmental responsibility.

E

Zero-waste shops are appearing in Europe's high streets. Customers fill their own bottles with cleaning products and choose dried foods from bulk containers. Shop owners buy in bulk from suppliers who use recyclable packaging. This approach reduces waste and encourages customers to be environmentally responsible while shopping for everyday items in a more sustainable way.

F

Shopping choices can sometimes be misleading. Glass production uses more fossil fuels than plastic, and it is heavier to transport. Paper bags also have higher carbon emissions and are harder to reuse than plastic bags. Experts suggest that long-term solutions should focus on both materials and consumer habits to truly reduce environmental impact.
