Many cruise ships, which take tourists to Antarctica, are members of the International Association of Antarctica Tour Operators (IAATO). They teach their passengers about Antarctica and its wildlife. The cruise companies also give money to environmental organizations in the region. These organizations want to help the nature and wildlife of Antarctica, so it doesn't change in the future.
